



Overseas trained Sport and Exercise Medicine Physician

Applying for recognition in Australia

All overseas trained Sport and Exercise Medicine (SEM) Physicians who wish to practise in Australia need to complete a specialist overseas trained specialist assessment with the ACSEP.

Before you can practise, the ACSEP will assess your education and training, SEM experience, recent practice and continuing professional development to determine whether all of these components together will enable you to practise at the level of an Australian trained Sport and Exercise Physician.

The ACSEP assesses overseas trained SEM Physician for which the College provides training. Please note that if you are have supervision requirements as per your assessment outcome, it is your responsibility to find a training position under the supervision of an ACSEP Fellow.

Stages of specialist assessment			
1.	Initial Assessment	The ACSEP OTS Committee will assess the application and determine whether the applicant is; <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Comparable- Partially Comparable- Not Comparable	Between 4-6 weeks
2.	Ongoing Assessment	The applicant will complete any outstanding requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Supervision- Part Two (Exit) Examination	Between 12-24 months as recommended by the OTS Committee
3.	Final Assessment	The ACSEP will decide whether the applicant has successfully completed their requirements. If successful, the ACSEP will recommend you to AHPRA for specialist registration	Approximately 2 months



Cost of OTS Assessment

There are fees applicable to the assessment of an applicant's application. The other fees payable are that of the Part Two (Exit) Examination.

Please note that payment of your application fee must be made before your application is processed.
